CHELSEA WATER DEPARTMENT ORDINANCE

As amended by the Chelsea Water Board on November 15, 2016.

Section 2. One Family Unit: A building that consists solely of one dwelling unit.

Section 3. Multi-family Dwelling Unit: A building that contains two or more dwelling units. Multi-family units on one service, in one building, shall each be liable to the above charge.

Pursuant to the provisions of 24 V.S.A. , Chapter 59 §1973, the citizens within the jurisdiction of the Chelsea Water Department have the right to disapprove this ordinance by submitting a petition, signed by not less than five (5) percent of the qualified voters, to the Chelsea Water Board or the Town Clerk, within forty-four (44) days following the date of its adoption by the Water Board. If no petition is submitted, this ordinance shall become effective on January 14, 2017, which is sixty (60) days from its adoption.
